

Lawrence Robbins, M.D.

Curriculum Vitae

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Summary

- Dr. Robbins is a neurologist specializing in headache, with certificates in pain management, headache, and psychopharmacology. He is an Associate Professor of Neurology, Rosalind Franklin Medical School (Chicago Medical School). He is also a Professor of Research, Des Moines Medical College. He was Assistant Professor of Neurology at Rush Medical College from 1992-2011. Dr. Robbins holds the title of Master Psychopharmacologist and Master Clinician through the Neuroscience Education Institute.
- He is a Fellow of the American Headache Society, as well as a Fellow of the American Association of Integrative Medicine.
- Vice President of the World Headache Society (2022-2023)
- Dr. Robbins published on the immune system and headache (one of the first to do so) in 1987; in 2021 he finished a study, rooted in evolution and the immune system, re-introducing (benign) worm eggs into the GI system of patients with severe headaches. This has

been published.

- VuMedi: Dr. Robbins has 36 talks on VuMedi (a free medical video site). These include refractory chronic migraine, several on the neuro exam, deconstructing the art of headache medicine, evolutionary medicine, neuropathy, epilepsy, visual snow/tinnitus/hypervigilance/chronic migraine, controversies in headache, bipolar, personality disorders, and others.
- Dr. Robbins is the author of six books: 1) Neurology and Psychiatry: Lectures and Clinical Pearls (2025). This book provides hundreds of practical pearls and tips on becoming a better provider. It has received outstanding reviews. There is a Spanish edition of this book. 2) Management of Headache and Headache Medications, first and second edition. The book, written primarily for physicians, enjoyed much critical acclaim; the second edition was one of the top-selling books in its class. 3) Headache Help, with Susan Lang, is for the patient. Headache Help, one of the best-selling books on headache, was also out in two editions. 4) Headache 2013: A Comprehensive Guide to Headache Treatment, Including Advanced Approaches for When Nothing Has Helped. This ebook, which contains highlights of Dr. Robbins' extensive

writings, was for doctors and patients. 5) The book, *Advanced Headache Therapy: Outpatient Strategies* was issued in 2015; primarily for physicians, this book has served as a guide towards treating patients with a difficult headache situation. 6) Dr. Robbins published a book in 2022: *Stuff You Should Know: for Doctors, NPs, and PAs: Clinical Pearls in General Medicine and Office Practice*.

- Dr. Robbins has written or contributed towards more than 420 articles and abstracts. His research has ranged from psychological aspects of headache to the immune system to advanced MRI studies in chronic migraine patients, to studies on newer drugs (such as CGRP antagonists).

- Dr. Robbins is involved in a great deal of headache research and lectures extensively. The latest research focused on evolutionary medicine, migraine, and the immune system (particularly the role of worms/parasites and the immune system). He usually lectures on the management of chronic headache, as well as psychiatric conditions in headache patients. The latest talks are:

1. *Deconstructing the Art of Headache Medicine*, 2. *Refractory Chronic Headache: What to Do When Nothing is Working*, 3.

Personality Disorders and the Bipolar Spectrum (in pain patients, and a separate talk developed for schools), 4. Evolutionary Medicine, Psychiatry, and Neurology, 5. Neurotransmitters, 6. Visual Snow, Tinnitus, Chronic Migraine, and Hypervigilance: Similarities, 7. Alzheimer's and Mild Cognitive Impairment, 8. Epilepsy, 9. Peripheral Neuropathy, 10. Movement Disorders (including Parkinson's), 11. Chaos, Neurology and Evolution, 12. Genetics of Migraine, and 13. Controversies and Issues in Headache.

- Dr. Robbins started the section of the American Headache Society, “The Refractory Patient: What to do When Nothing is Working”. He has written extensively on refractory, “difficult to treat” patients and approaches.
- In 1986, Dr. Robbins founded the Robbins Headache Clinic where he treated patients with various types of headaches. Dr. Robbins, and the rest of the clinic staff, treated patients in a comprehensive manner. Each patient received a good deal of time and attention. Treatment has been highly individualized and offers a wide range of options.

- Dr. Robbins has lectured extensively from 2020 to 2024 to a number of international groups, including the Asia Pacific Headache Society, the World Headache Society, the Bangladesh Neurologists, to Mideast (particularly Jordan and Iraq) neurologists, as well as to doctors on Sierra Leone. The topics have been headache, psychiatry, and evolutionary medicine.
- The educational site, www.RobbinsHeadacheClinic.com, was edited by Dr. Robbins and his staff. More than 15,000 visitors a month used the site for information on headaches. The site summarized the best headache articles of recent months and had been doing so since 1999. The most popular section is still the blog, which is usually updated daily. There have been over 2,000 blogs.
- Dr. Robbins was involved in the effort to promote a 2018 bill, eliminating tackle football (in Illinois) under age 12. Dr. Robbins and Illinois House Representative Carol Sente's efforts led to Governor Quinn's signing of HB 5431, the Mandatory Concussion Education for High School Coaches and Athletic Directors, on August 19, 2014. The IHSA adopted most of Dr. Robbins'

proposed practice changes (football). He started this push in 2013, with a bill to limit hitting in football practice. The bill was defeated by USA Football and the NFL, but the proposed changes were adopted by the Illinois High School Association.

- Dr. Robbins wrote a major chapter, “Refractory Chronic Migraine”, for a Scientific American Neurology online textbook, 2016-2017. This has been updated for publication.
- Dr. Robbins was identified by the National Headache Foundation with “Added Qualification in Headache Medicine”, October 2016. (a certificate in advanced headache practice)
- In 2017, Dr. Robbins established a neurology clinic in rural Honduras. He goes there regularly and also skypes with patients from his office in Illinois. He has recruited 5 Honduran neurologists and psychiatrists to staff the clinic. This clinic serves a population of 400,000 people who have little access to neurology. The clinic is non-profit; The American Headache Association funds the clinic. For his work in Honduras, Dr. Robbins was nominated in 2019 through 2024 for an AAN

(neurology) award given to a neurologist who serves indigent patients.

- Dr. Robbins is an Associate Professor of Neurology, Rosalind Franklin Medical School (CMS); previously he held similar posts in the neurology departments of the University of Illinois, and Rush Medical College in Chicago. He is also a Professor of Research at the medical school in Des Moines.

- Dr. Robbins teaches neurology to medical students on a daily basis. He also teaches psychiatry and neurology to psychiatry residents in several academic psychiatric programs. In addition, Dr. Robbins teaches evolutionary medicine, in particular “evolutionary psychiatry and neurology”.

- 2022 – 2025 - Dr. Robbins is in the midst of completing an ongoing 300-hour course with updates in neurology.

Awards

- Dr. Robbins was given a “top” teacher award through Chicago Medical School and was nominated for 4 teaching awards in 2022 and 2023, one of them a national award. These were for his work with medical students and residents at Chicago Medical School.
- In every year from 2002-2025, Dr. Robbins has been named to the “America’s Top Doctors” list created by Castle Connolly and now published in U.S. News and World Report. Also, Dr. Robbins is one of a select group of doctors within that list who are considered to be among the top 1% in the nation in his specialty. Chicago Magazine lists Dr. Robbins as one of the Top Doctors in Chicago.
- Dr. Robbins was given the award (by the Southern Headache Society) for “second place for blog of the year on functional neurologic disorder”, 2023.
- In 2021, Dr. Robbins was nominated for the national AAMC (American Medical College) Arnold P. Gold award in humanism, awarded yearly to one physician who teaches medical students.

- In 2008, the American Academy of Pain Management selected Dr. Robbins as the recipient of the “Janet Travell Clinical Pain Management Award,” given to one physician per year.

Research

Helminth Worm Study

Dr. Robbins launched a new project, 2020 to 2021. This evaluated the role of parasites and worms in migraine. Dr. Robbins conducted a study (published in 2021) evaluating the effect of re-introducing worm eggs into the GI tract of those with severe, refractory chronic migraine. The study was finally completed in 2021. The theory is that parasites and worms have lived in the GI tract of primates forever; now that they have been (for the most part) eliminated from Western societies, immune diseases have greatly increased. The worms and parasites dampen down the natural immune response; without them, immunological disorders (and migraine has a significant immune component) have surfaced due to an enhanced immune response.

Patient Satisfaction Survey: patients were queried in Dr. Robbins's Honduras clinic: results were published (2024)

This research also focused on countries where worms and parasites have continued to be prevalent or have recently been eliminated. Migraine rates will be compared. This also involved studying the effects in Hunter-gatherer societies (such as the Tsimane in

Bolivia). The hope is that we can identify a molecule in certain worms/parasites that may be used therapeutically for migraine.

CGRP Antagonists for the Prevention of Migraine: Real Life Experience

Dr. Robbins had been conducting and publishing research on the efficacy and side effects of the newer CGRP monoclonal antibodies. Research conducted 2018-2019.

Long-term Progress of Patients with Personality Disorders and Headache

Dr. Robbins and staff undertook a new study of how people with personality disorders progress over a long period of time. Using a time frame of 10 to 20 years, the researchers will look at whether moods, pain, and functioning improve, or worsen, over time.

PFO and Migraine Trials

A patent foramen ovale (PFO) is a small hole in the heart, which is normal in fetal development, but should close in infancy. Unclosed or partly-closed PFOs may affect 20-25% of the population. Dr. Robbins served on a committee (2007-15) adjudicating a long

research study that helped to determine whether closing the PFO helps headache patients, by preventing unoxidized blood from circulating in the brain. This study was one of the first in the United States; research from Europe suggested that repairing the PFO does improve migraine in many patients. This major PFO study did turn out to be negative, not achieving its primary endpoint.

Advanced Imaging in Episodic and Chronic Migraine Patients

Dr. Robbins and associates have used techniques such as DTI to compare migraine patients to patients without migraine. Advanced imaging, using diffusion-tensor imaging and functional MRI, is producing a unique view of the brain's operation. This research, which was conducted with Dr. Cameron Leith, has revealed subtle white-matter changes in the brains of chronic migraine patients. These changes were seen primarily in the areas involved with migraine such as the brainstem, but were not seen in the control patients without migraine.

Headache Drug Trials

Dr. Robbins has been a principal investigator for a number (approximately 16) multicenter drug trials. Dr. Robbins has participated in a multi-center trial for an implantable device in the SPG, for refractory chronic cluster. There is ongoing research in the field of CGRP injections for chronic migraine.

Safety of Frequent Triptan Use

With refractory headaches, when absolutely nothing works, patients are often prescribed triptans over many years. There is a need to determine if triptans have additional side effects when used for prolonged periods. Dr. Robbins has done several studies in this area and will continue to research the safety of frequent or daily triptan use.

Long-term Safety of Botulinum Toxin

Dr. Robbins has utilized Botulinum toxin since 1998 for headache disorders, and has previously studied long-term safety in this area. He and his staff will start a new study in 2024, which will evaluate the treatment in these patients many years after treatment.

Psychological Aspects Accompanying Headache: Bipolar Disorder, Personality Disorders, Anxiety, Depression, ADD

With a major interest in the psychiatric aspects of headache patients, Dr. Robbins has published extensively in this area. Current studies include the comorbidity of headache with personality disorders and bipolar disorder, and there is consideration for expanding research into MRI studies of bipolar patients.

Media and Public Appearances

Top Doctors List (US and Chicago)

In every year since its debut in 2002, Dr. Robbins has been included in the annual book of “America’s Top Doctors: The Best in American Medicine.” These doctors are nominated through recommendations from other physicians; Dr. Robbins is in the pain management section. The list is published in U.S. News and World Report. Also, Dr. Robbins is one of a select group of doctors within that list who are considered to be among the top 1% in the nation in his specialty. He also is included in “Chicago’s Top Doctors,” which appears locally in Chicago Magazine, under Top Doctors, Pain Management. Dr. Robbins was under consideration for the Clinical Excellence Award, given to several doctors per year, for 2015.

Concussion Public Awareness Campaign

Dr. Robbins conducted public outreach in 2012-13 that successfully raised public awareness about the risks of brain damage from youth tackle football. This campaign educated community members about the headaches, memory problems, and other health impacts being caused by the sport, as well as how to protect the kids who play tackle football. Dr. Robbins attempted in 2014 and 2015, and will further attempt in 2016, to introduce

legislation in the Illinois Legislature limiting tackle football to age 14 and older. His latest OPEDs to raise public awareness about concussions were on hockey and soccer, and were in RealClearSports.com in 2016.

Dr. Robbins raised the issue with Illinois State Rep. Carol Sente, who as a result introduced a bill in the Illinois General Assembly in February 2013 to restrict tackling during school football practice. Dr. Robbins spoke at a public hearing on the bill, and testified about it before a legislative committee. Although the bill was not initially passed into law, Dr. Robbins and Rep. Sente plan on re-submitting the legislation. The Illinois High School Association did change practice and pre-season rules because of this initiative.

Dr. Robbins wrote several articles/op-ed columns that were published in print and online, and conducted outreach to Illinois print, television and radio journalists that contributed to widespread media coverage of the issue in February and March 2013.

Dr. Robbins and Illinois House Representative Carol Sente's efforts led to Governor Quinn's signing of HB 5431, the

Mandatory Concussion Education for High School Coaches and Athletic Directors, on August 19, 2014.

Dr. Robbins' OPED on football was used in a book, "Along These Lines: Writing Sentences and Paragraphs" by John Biays and Carol Wershoven, sixth edition, published 1/2015.

Dr. Robbins helped pursue an effort to introduce an Illinois bill restricting tackle football to age 12 on up. The hope was that, prior to age 12, the kids would simply play touch and flag football. This Illinois House legislation was introduced in January of 2018. The bill passed the House Committee, which was the furthest a bill of its kind had progressed. However, the football bill was not successful in the Illinois House.

Dr. Robbins was on a panel in April 2018 (with Chris Nowinski, CTE and Concussion Legacy Foundation) that debated the issue of tackle under age 12.

Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel (HBO) interviewed Dr. Robbins for a show on football and concussions (January, 2019).

Dr. Robbins attempted to have the football bill introduced on a national level; and also to re-introduce in Illinois, (2019).

Print Media

Dr. Robbins was interviewed by the Quad City Times (2018) about treatment of difficult (refractory) headaches.

Dr. Robbins was interviewed a number of times for a major investigative piece, on opioids and OxyContin, in the LA Times in 2016.

Dr. Robbins is a frequent contributor to national and local magazines and newspapers. He was featured in 2013 in a *The North Shore Weekend* article.

Dr. Robbins's OPED on "stopping tackle football under age 12" was published in 2018. It appeared in a # of Illinois newspapers and websites. His op-ed article about football concussions was published on *RealClearSports* (a sister site of RealClearPolitics) in December 2012, and reprinted in a number of newspapers. He was quoted on the issue by newspapers that included the Chicago Tribune, Daily Herald, the Pantagraph in Bloomington, the

Chronicle in DeKalb, the Northbrook Tower, and a number of Pioneer Press newspapers in the Chicago suburbs. Many of these outlets mentioned Dr. Robbins in multiple articles that provided ongoing coverage of the issue. In addition, the Chicago Tribune also interviewed Dr. Robbins in June 2013 for a separate story about a concussion suffered by a high school athlete.

Dr. Robbins also was quoted in the Chicago Tribune in April 2012 regarding the use of TMS in treating depression. The Tribune featured him in an article on adolescent headache by Dawn Turner Trice on September 28, 2011. In 2008, he was the focus of a column by Paula Kamen in the New York Times. Dr. Robbins was quoted in a June 2012 column entitled “What You Might Not Know about Treating Migraines” that was published in the Daily Muse and the Forbes website. In August, 2008, Evanston Hospital’s magazine, Connections, featured a full article on Dr. Robbins and his specialty in adolescent headaches.

Over the last ten years, Dr. Robbins has been quoted in or contributed to articles in USA Today, MSN.com, the Chicago Tribune, the Chicago Sun-Times, Glamour, Cosmopolitan, Good Housekeeping, Oxygen, Self, Men’s Health, Women’s World, Health Magazine, Women’s Fitness, North Shore Magazine and

Fibromyalgia Network. The book, *Doctor's Home Remedies*, used a number of his quotations. He was interviewed in 2020 for a new article on the risks of football.

Television

Dr. Robbins was interviewed for an HBO documentary (*Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel*). This appeared in January 2019. The piece focused on his work in attempting to limit tackle football under age 12. In addition, it discussed issues surrounding the long-term effects of football on the brain.

Dr. Robbins was interviewed in Montreal for the Fall (November) 2018 documentary on opioids, on CBC Radio (TV), Canada (Canadian Public TV). He was dubbed into French. The piece focused on his early experiences with Oxycontin and the company, Purdue.

John Oliver Show (HBO): in October 2016, John Oliver did a piece on opioids; for this, his show interviewed Dr. Robbins, revolving around a 1999 study funded by Purdue Pharma.

Dr. Robbins has appeared numerous times on local news shows as an expert on headache and its treatment. WLS-TV quoted him

about youth football concussion in February 2013. Dr. Robbins was interviewed on WTTW's Chicago Tonight in March, 2008, and appeared on Fox-TV News in February, 2008. He was seen on the newsmagazine 20/20 in a segment on headache and perfume, and was interviewed on ABC's Nightline as a whistleblower in the controversy over false marketing of Stadol nasal spray.

Radio

Dr. Robbins was doing a ½ hour radio show (on medical topics), 2020, on WCPT 820 AM Chicago. It was as a guest during drive time of the radio host, Joan Esposito. This show was twice per month and had been popular.

Dr. Robbins has appeared as a guest on various radio programs. In September 2014, he appeared on SportsMedicineWeekly, with Dr. Brian Cole (AM 1000), discussing exercise and headache. In December 2012, he was interviewed on WGN-Chicago 720 about football and concussions, and was mentioned in a report on the issue by WBBM Newsradio. He had previously appeared as a guest on WGN's The Milt Rosenberg Show, and on HealthTalk Radio. He had his own medical call-in show during 2005. The XM Satellite Radio Health Show has interviewed him on a number of

topics.

Online

Dr. Robbins has 38 videos on VuMedi (a free medical video site) on various topics (primarily neurology).

Dr. Robbins was interviewed by VJ Neurology (videos online) on the subject of monoclonal antibodies for headache, 2021.

Dr. Robbins did a debate at CONY 2021(Controversies in Neurology), and this is online at CONY.

In 2021 Dr. Robbins established a YouTube channel, “Lawrence Robbins MD”; this channel contained various headache videos, along with videos of The Honduras Neurology and Psychiatry Clinic.

In June 2020, Dr. Robbins was interviewed by Practical Pain Management on: Migraine and Mental Health.

Dr. Robbins was interviewed in 2018 for several podcasts on ReachMD, an online portal for physicians.

Dr. Robbins and his wife, Sue, hosted an online medical talk radio show on “Talk Zone”; they did 22 one-hour shows.

Blog

Dr. Robbins and his wife, Sue, create and edit a popular blog at www.RobbinsHeadacheClinic.com that is updated almost daily. For many years this blog has included posts about various subjects.

Reviews

Dr. Robbins was a member of the Editorial Board of Practical Pain Management. He has been a reviewer for several medical journals, including the American Headache Society Journal, International Headache Society Journal, Headache, Cephalalgia, and Practical Pain Management (on the editorial board for Practical Pain Management). Consultant: Consultations in Primary Care, Clinical Drug Investigation and the American Journal of Pain Management. Dr. Robbins reviewed a book for Nature Medicine. He was a reviewer for the American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists, and for Clinical and Surgery Ophthalmology.

National And International Talks

During 2021 to 2024 Dr. Robbins gave a number of new talks to U.S. and International conferences (6 conferences total).

Dr. Robbins debated on the subject of monoclonal antibodies for migraine (he took the position that they were not safe) in the World Congress on Controversies in Neurology, 2022; this is archived on the CONY website.

Dr. Robbins gave 2 talks at the annual Southern Headache Society meeting (2021) on: 1. Treatment of refractory chronic migraine, and 2. Evolutionary neurology and migraine.

In 2020, Dr. Robbins developed a lecture on Evolutionary Medicine and Neurology; he gave this to several groups, including the Asia Pacific Headache Society, and the World Headache Society. Dr. Robbins also spoke to this society on Deconstructing the Art of Headache Medicine.

Dr. Robbins did a video talk on deconstructing the art of headache medicine for the American Migraine Foundation, July 2018.

In 2016 Dr. Robbins created 2 new talks, Refractory Chronic Migraine, and Advanced Clinical Pearls; these were for neurology grand rounds and a symposium at the Southern Headache Society, Sept. 2016 (Asheville).

Dr. Robbins had been in charge of the poster section of the American Association of Pain Management meetings, 2010-13. He has also chaired headache talks at the annual AAPM meeting from 2010-2013. He gave a talk at the 2013 meeting, “Advanced Clinical Headache Pearls”, which he has given to a number of university grand rounds.

Dr. Robbins was selected as chairperson for the American Association of Pain Management Headache Symposium in Las Vegas, September 2011, and served as Chair for the meetings in 2010, 2011 and 2012. In 2008, he organized a series of lectures to be given during the academy's national meeting in Nashville, and at the 2009 national meeting of the American Academy of Pain Management in Phoenix. He was chair of Headache Symposium at the American Association of Pain Medicine meeting, 2010.

Dr. Robbins was a key speaker at the September 2022 "Clusterbuster" conference in Chicago, addressing the treatment of refractory cluster headaches. He also spoke at this conference in 2009, 2011 and 2013.

The Depression and Bipolar Support Alliance selected Dr. Robbins as a speaker for their national conference in October, 2006. In the same month, he delivered a lecture entitled "Daily Headache" for the Neurology Update seminar at the Johns Hopkins Advanced Studies in Medicine.

In 2005, Dr. Robbins was selected by the CME Corporation as a speaker in a series of lectures in Chicago, Las Vegas and Los Angeles, and the lectures taped for later use. The CME Practical Home Study Course features his lectures on headache and pain. The US Psychiatry and Mental Health Congress, held in November of 2005, selected Dr. Robbins as its specialist on headache.

2021 to 2024: Dr. Robbins gave a number of new neurology and psychiatry talks, to the medical students (various medical schools around Chicago) and to the Rush, Loyola, Chicago Medical School. One of the new talks is on Evolutionary Medicine, Evolutionary Psychiatry, and Evolutionary Neurology. He also has a new talk on monoclonal antibodies for migraine.

In 2020 and 2021, Dr. Robbins began lecturing internationally to the Asia Pacific Headache Society and the World Headache Society, along with neurologists in Bangladesh, and the Mideast (particularly Jordan and Iraq). These talks focused on headache, psychiatry, and evolutionary medicine. He gave lectures to the World Headache Society course on headache, January 2021.

Dr. Robbins was the founder of the section of the American Headache Society designated for Refractory Headache Patients. The section is devoted to finding treatments for patients for whom “nothing works.” Dr. Robbins was also a member of AHS special interest groups on Cluster Headache, Behavioral Issues, Women’s Issues and Adolescent Headache.

Dr. Robbins is strongly committed to the education of physicians on pain and headache issues. He has taught both formal and informal groups of physicians and medical students. Dr. Robbins currently is training medical, NP, and PA students, who usually spend from one week to one month in the clinic. The students have primarily been from Chicago Medical School, as well as

Midwestern University (Medical School). He is the main neurology instructor for the fourth-year students.

For his work in Honduras, Dr. Robbins was nominated for a (2019 thru 2024) AAN award given to a neurologist who serves indigent patients.

Since 1991, Dr. Robbins has worked with several drug companies on improving the performance of pharmaceutical representatives. The goal is to improve the effectiveness of doctor-representative communications, an important part of modern medical practice. In addition to formal lectures, he participated in role-play training and mentoring.

Early in his career, Dr. Robbins was a volunteer neurologist in the Neurology Clinic at the University of Illinois in Chicago. More recently, he volunteered his services for two years as a neurologist at the free clinic in Waukegan, Illinois, known as Healthreach.

Dr. Robbins was volunteering, as a neurologist, at a free health clinic in Highwood, Illinois (Fenix clinic).

Dr. Robbins was a volunteer neurologist at one of the inner-city

Chicago Hospitals, Loretto Hospital.

American Headache Association (AHA) The AHA is a registered 501(c) (3) public charitable organization. Donations are tax deductible, for state and federal taxes.

The AHA has a number of missions, primarily:

Setting up and managing a free rural neurology clinic in Honduras. The clinic serves a large area that has no access to neurologists. Dr. Robbins goes to Honduras to treat patients (primarily migraine and epilepsy patients). He also manages the Honduras neurology patients remotely thru Tele-Neurology. We have recruited two Honduran neurologists, two psychiatrists, and a nurse-administrator to also staff the clinic. Dr. Robbins, through the AHA, has provided hundreds of thousands of free medicines to Honduras patients (primarily epilepsy and migraine medications). The Honduran clinic, and Dr. Robbins's work, was featured in a 2018 article appearing in *Neurology Today*. A new article was published on the clinic in *World Neurology*, 2021, and also in 2024. Dr. Robbins was nominated for an award given by the American Academy of Neurology for volunteer neurology work with indigent patients.

Update on Honduras: 2024 - we now have 5 physicians (neurology and psychiatry), we provide everything free (consults, meds, labs, EEGs), and we see thousands of patients. Dr Robbins funds this through his non-profit (to contribute, please call our office or email Dr. Robbins at lrobb98@icloud.com). We provide hundreds of thousands of tablets of medicines each year. We are also providing hundreds of thousands of free prenatal vitamins to pregnant women who cannot afford them.

- By providing free headache and epilepsy medications, primarily triptans and anticonvulsants, to indigent patients, we hope to improve their quality of life. Our goal is to give at least 600,000 tablets, primarily to Honduran patients.
- Educating healthcare providers about headache is a main objective. We have provided books, articles, and lectures (live, and also via YouTube/websites). If we educate the physicians and nurses, this will lead to greatly improved care.
- We hope to educate patients by providing free books, articles, and video lectures. To reach a large number of patients, we will do much of our education via the internet.

- Funding for headache studies is lacking. We hope to provide funds for studies that will have a direct impact on people's lives.

Dr. Robbins served as a Board Member of the nonprofit profit Julian Grace Foundation. Julian Grace is involved in funding a number of non-profits.

Personal

An expert bridge player, Dr. Robbins took second in the 2013 National Open Pairs (Spring Nationals). He has been in the "Bridge Trials, USA" most years since 2015. He represented the area in the Grand National Pairs and Teams, 2017. Dr. Robbins was on one of the final 12 teams at the 2013 "U.S. Team Trials" to pick the U.S. representative. He represented the United States at the 1996 World Bridge Olympiad in Rhodes, Greece, and at the 1992 Pan American Games. His titles include United States Grand National Team Champion, 1979, 1991, 1995 and NCAA Champion, 1976. Dr. Robbins is on the panel of The Bridge World magazine. He has written a number of bridge articles for various publications. He is an announcer on the site Bridge Base Online.

He played in the World Senior Pair Championships, Orlando, Sept. 2018.

Dr. Robbins is also an avid rollerblader and ice hockey player. He has represented the Chicago area in the national, over-50, ice hockey tournament. In 2024, Dr. Robbins was on the first-place team in the 70-75 age range. Dr. Robbins was on the third-place team at the “Snoopy” National 50 and older hockey championships in 2010. Dr. Robbins came in 2nd in the 2014 National Age Adjusted Hockey Championships, which took place in Santa Rosa, California. He plans on playing in the Snoopy national championships in July, 2025.
